

HARLAXTON



LONDON WEEKEND TR2P

17-19 January Cost: £340

JOIN YOUR NEW HARLAXTON classmates in England's capital city for a weekend to explore and take in all the iconic London landmarks.

We stay in the very centrally located Bloomsbury neighbourhood with the British Museum, Covent Garden and the West End theatre district within walking distance of the hotel.

We travel to London by coach and after dropping our luggage at the hotel we will head out on a guided walking tour with a London Tour Guide so you can get your bearings.

On Sunday we check out of our hotel and make our way back to Harlaxton, via Hogwarts! We will visit the WB Studios "The Making of Harry Potter".

LZNCOLN DAY TRZP

All students in ID 235 and British Hauntings are required to attend this trip and will be automatically signed up.

MOST FAMOUS FOR ITS CATHEDRAL and castle, Lincoln is one of England's oldest cities, with remains of settlements on the site tracing back to the Iron Age. Built on the bank of the river Witham, the historic city is as much known for its beauty as the incline it was built onto.

Both the castle, which was built by the Normans in the 11th century, and the cathedral, which for 200 years was the world's tallest building, are located high on the hill overseeing the rest of the city. On a clear day, Lincoln Cathedral can even be seen on the horizon from Harlaxton. By visiting both you'll have the opportunity to see two of England's oldest and most important historical and architectural landmarks first-hand. Not only will you learn more about this country, but also the area in which you are studying.

You will also have free time to explore the city by yourselves.

NOTTONGHOM DOY TROP

FAMOUS THANKS TO THE fantastical tales of Robin Hood,
Nottingham has far more to offer than just stories. Built around Nottingham
Castle, the city has been a centre of tourism, economy and sports in Britain for centuries, exemplified by the National Justice Museum. Located in a former
Victorian courtroom, jail and police station, the Justice Museum offers a wide range of activities.

In addition to exploring Nottingham's history, you'll have the opportunity to explore its geography as well, visiting the vast, complex network of caves and tunnels that tangle beneath the surface of the city. With over 800 separate, hidden caverns, Nottingham is host to the UK's largest network of caves and on your visit, you'll be able to learn how these caves were formed and how they have been used over the city's long history.

You will also have free time to explore the city by yourselves.

9XF9RD, BATH & ST9NEHENGE WEEKEND TR2P

31 January - 2 February Cost: £330

THIS WEEKEND TRIP BEGINS IN Oxford, where we will be taken on a guided walking tour to learn more about both the city and the world-famous University's history.

Next we head to the Roman city of Bath.

Named after its Roman-built baths, the city is full of history with its Georgian architecture often catching the eye of film makers. Built for pleasure and relaxation, Bath has been a wellbeing destination since the Roman times. The ancient Roman baths are available to visit as well as the modern Thermae Bath Spa, which houses the only natural thermal hot springs in the country that can be bathed in.

We end with a visit to the megalithic stones of Stonehenge. You'll have the opportunity to learn more at the visitor centre and spend time admiring the stones in the Wiltshire countryside.

Friday, 7 February Cost: £10 deposit


All students in COM 380 are required to attend this trip and will be automatically signed up.

Leicester (pronounced Less-ter), one of
England's oldest and most diverse cities.
A centre for culture, sport and food,
Leicester has something to offer for
everyone, be it visiting one of the many
theatres, exploring the wide variety of
shops, or sampling some of the vast
selection of local food on offer. If you are
looking to try the British national dish of
curry, Leicester is the place to do it!

Leicester also has a long and rich history for you to explore, notably the recently discovered resting place of King Richard III. Whilst the remains of this once-lost monarch have been moved and reburied with a little more fanfare, the site is open to the public so you can learn about the bizarre circumstances of the King's rediscovery and his life prior to his death.

A VISIT TO STRATFORD-UPON-AVON wouldn't be complete without a visit to William Shakespeare's childhood home in the heart of city. Hear tales of Shakespeare's family life and get up close to objects from the Shakespeare Birthplace Trust's world class collections as you discover how the extraordinary playwright continues to shape our lives today.

Beyond the many museums and preserved houses that once belonged to Shakespeare and his family, Stratford also offers a broad variety of shops and restaurants for you to visit whilst you explore this picturesque town.

The Royal Shakespeare Company (RSC) have based themselves in Stratford, and put on various productions from Shakespeare's catalogue on a regular basis. Tours of the RSC Theatre are also possible, but be sure to book in advance to avoid disappointment.

EDINBURGH WEEKEND TRIP


14 - 16 February Cost: £380

JOIN YOUR HARLAXTON FRIENDS for a weekend in Scotland's capital city for a weekend in "Auld Reekie"!

We stay just off the Royal Mile within walking distance of the Edinburgh highlights of the Edinburgh Castle, Palace of Holyrood and Arthur's Seat. Perfect for exploring Auld Reekie.

Included in the cost is a Guided Walking Tour of Edinburgh to help you get your bearings; entry into Edinburgh Castle; and a 48-hour hop-on/hop-off bus pass for three different routes with audio commentary, around Edinburgh's Old and New Towns and out to the Port of Leith where the Royal Yacht Britannia is docked.

FOUNDED BY THE ROMANS, invaded by the Vikings, and the home city of one half of the War of the Roses, York has always been an important city throughout British History, and it certainly reflects that. With many buildings remaining of the original settlement, and a great wall still standing that once protected the city, you don't have to visit a museum to see the city's past.

NORTH WALES WEEKEND TRZP


21-23 March Cost: £280


THE NORTH WALES WEEKEND IS regularly ranked by Harlaxton students as one of the top excursions! Join us for a fun-filled weekend away to Wales! See North Wales' distinctive regional identity in our base for the weekend, Llandudno and enjoy walks along the strand (beach), down the 2,295-ft Llandudno Pier, or up to Great Orme Park.

On Saturday morning we visit Caernarfon Castle, where the then Prince Charles was invested as the Prince of Wales in 1969. After lunch we will take a train ride up to the summit of Mount Snowdon or Yr Wyddfa in Welsh.

Before we leave Wales we will visit Zip World Betws-y-Coed to take a spin on the Fforest Coaster; the only alpine coaster of its kind, and soar through the Welsh countryside at speeds of 25 mph for the ultimate thrill!

HOME TO THE DUKE & DUCHESS of Devonshire, Chatsworth House is renowned for its quality of art, landscape and hospitality. There are over 25 rooms to explore within the house and the gardens are also rich in history, spanning 105-acres, it contains fascinating sculptures, waterworks and a Victorian garden.

This day trip also includes a visit to the historical village of Eyam in the Derbyshire Dales. The village became famous after the Black Death of 1665 and 1666, where the disease was contained when the villagers decided to isolate themselves from the surrounding communities.
